

Murray coached and taught at St. Mary's from 1954 through 1967 and was the longest -serving basketball coach to date. He amassed the most victories as a basketball coach all-time. He is the only St. Mary's coach to win three consecutive State Sectionals ('56, '57, and '58).

His teams were Sioux City Diocese Champions in '55, and runners-up in '57 and '64. His 1956 team came within one shot of making it to the State Tournament. He is one of only two basketball coaches to win 20 or more games in a season.

Coach Murray learned many of the fundamentals of the sports he coached while a player at Bancroft St. John's High School. The Johnies were the first private school to win the State Championship for fall baseball in 1943. Coach Murray played third base for the Johnies, alongside his brother, Tommy Murray (deceased), who pitched a four-hitter in that championship game and later died as a hero in World War II.
